

TAKE ACTION

Beyond Pink TEAM raised grant award amounts in 2024 to \$2,500 for people undergoing active treatment for breast cancer and \$3,000 for those with metastatic breast cancer. Thanks to donors and groups like the Hudson Leo Club (right), BPT was able to award a record \$198,396 in 146 grants to individuals, impacting 320 people in their households - an increase over 2023 of 48% in grant amounts and 33% in grant awards.



EDUCATE

Volunteers with Beyond Pink TEAM provided education about breast cancer at community events, including a Waterloo Bucks game in July (at left). ADVOCATE

These six local breast cancer (right) survivors represented Beyond Pink TEAM at the May 2024 National Breast Cancer Coalition Summit in Washington, D.C. They met with staff of Iowa's Congressional delegation to express support for the Metastatic Breast Cancer Access to Care Act. This would waive waiting periods for Medicare coverage for those diagnosed.



MAKE A DIFFERENCE

Each donation and every volunteer helps the organization fulfill its mission. The success of our work depends on volunteers and donors. Beyond Pink TEAM has no office or paid employees, and receives no government funding.

How grant money gets put to good use

Breast cancer patients fill out a grant request form that includes a description of their need and the amount requested. In 2024, 58% of grant money went toward medical bills.

The BPT treasurer pays those bills directly to the health care provider. Funds requested for transportation or groceries are disbursed in the form of gift cards. If there is an approved essential living expense, such as a rent payment, the treasurer issues a check to the landlord.

BPT can also provide funds for lymphedema compression sleeves and gloves.

18th Pink Ribbon Run sets records

A record **1,672 people** registered for the 18th Annual Pink Ribbon Run, held in downtown Cedar Falls on Saturday, October 5, and they raised a record **\$95,745** after expenses for Beyond Pink TEAM. Thanks to all who participated!

Cancer rates rising in Iowa

Iowans have cause for concern when it comes to cancer.

The state's Cancer in Iowa 2024 report tells us that our state continues to have the second highest and fastest-growing rate of new cancers in the U.S.

Breast cancer is the most often diagnosed in Iowa, totaling 14% of all cancers.

Iowa ranks 9th highest in the rate of new cases of female breast cancer in the U.S.

The good news is that survivors are living longer.
